

THE HEROES OF TELEMARK was a 70mm Panavision 'blow-up' in Australia. The Australian premiere season opened at the Barclay Sydney in 35mm on the 11<sup>th</sup> March 1966. The first 70mm presentation was at the Chelsea Melbourne on the 10<sup>th</sup> June 1966. There was one 70mm print of THE HEREOS OF TELEMARK in circulation in Australia.

Reading through the release dates [bottom page], there were four print moves for *Print 1*. The Sydney, Canberra, Parramatta, Perth and Hobart seasons were presented in 35mm.

The Heroes of Telemark remains a mystery for the 70mm enthusiast why Sydney was presented in 35mm when a 70mm print was in circulation in Australia as indicated in Trevor Walters's book - Greater Union's, Chelsea Melbourne, the Royal Newcastle print log book and the tabloid advertisements for the Royal Lithgow, Wests Adelaide and the George Brisbane indicating a 70mm presentation. It is also worth mentioning the Lithgow Royal advertisement [seen left] states 'Direct from a Magnificent 20-week Season in



Sydney' – which is incorrect. *The Heroes of Telemark* season at the Barclay, Sydney was 13-weeks. As the Lithgow Royal season opened during the 70mm dates at the Chelsea, we are further investigating whether the Chelsea season was replaced by a 35mm print to the allow for the print move to the Royal Lithgow.

It is apparent when reading through the opening and closing dates, the two Cinerama prints from the Plaza

Theatres, Sydney and Melbourne, were also used for the regional and interstate seasons. It is also apparent a third print was added in 1967, which has been shown below for the season at the Royal Perth. Where this print originated, is unknown.





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
